Invites Nigeria to submit an application and approves an extension to do so by no later than April 30, 2025, for a system transformation grant of up to a total of US\$75.313 million, in reference to FRC/2021/09-01, and in accordance with the strategic parameters for GPE support as set out in Table 1, with the option to include an additional \$32.277 million, the release of which is conditioned on GPE Board decision that top-up triggers have been achieved.
